

TSGT STUTTS CALICE



TSgt Stutts Calice graduated from Marion Abramson High School, New Orleans, Louisiana in 1971. He enlisted in the Air Force in 1972 and served as a Radar Operator during his career in the Air Force. His initial assignment out of technical school was at Bergstrom AFB, Austin, Texas as a radar operator.

TSgt Calice has had several assignments during his military career. His next assignment in 1973 was at Kokha, Thailand where he worked in space tracking surveillance. Following that was Houston, Texas where he worked with the Federal Aviation Administration. In 1975 his next assignment was Slidell, Louisiana working surveillance again with the FAA. An overseas assignment in 1979 found him in Kotzebue, Alaska working with the over-the-horizon radar that kept watch on the northern borders. In 1980 he was reassigned to Dallas, Oregon working surveillance. He worked for Tactical Air

Command in Prum, Germany in 1983 next then back to the U.S. His final assignment in the Air Force was at MacDill AFB, Florida before finally retiring after 20 years of service in 1992.

TSgt Calice has been teaching Air Force JROTC since 1997. He first taught at Alcee Fortier High School in New Orleans, Louisiana then at Destrehan High School, Destrehan, Louisiana. After moving from the New Orleans area after Hurricane Katrina, TSgt Calice took a position as a JROTC instructor at Flower Mound High School, in the Dallas Ft/Worth area.

TSgt Calice is an accomplished singer and has performed with the Tulane Summer Lyric Theater at Tulane University and in the All State Choir of Louisiana. He was a member of the singing group ðSaøveyö playing at many sites in the New Orleans area for several years.

TSgt Stutts Calice has been married to the former Ernestine Lotten of New Orleans, Louisiana for over 30 years. They have two daughters: Natasha and Chablis both living in the DFW area.
